





How has COVID-19 progressed through Africa? COVID-19 pandemic was confirmed to have reached Africa in February, 2020 when Egypt, Nigeria and Algeria confirmed their first cases. By 13th May, all countries in Africa had recorded at least one



case, with Djibouti and Gabon having the highest prevalence.





Within the East African region, economies have also subsequently suffered and a total of 262 initiatives were undertaken in the region, with 50.8% being country specific and 49.2% being multi-regional.
